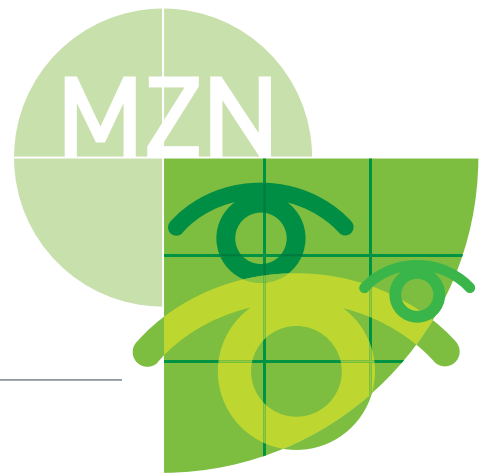

Price-to-Book ratio ("P/B") is equal to a stock's market capitalization divided by its book value. (This ratio compares the market's valuation of a company with the value of that company as indicated on its financial statements.)

The Claymore/Morningstar Information Super Sector Index ETF seeks investment results that correspond generally to the performance, before the Fund's fees and expenses, of an equity index called the Morningstar Information Super Sector Index. The Index is designed to identify and track companies in industries that support and facilitate the exchange of ideas and information as a basis for commerce. Eligible Index securities include the total investable universe of the software, hardware, media and telecommunications sectors. Morningstar, Inc., the Fund's index provider, classifies companies into the industry that best reflects each company's underlying business activities based on the largest source of revenue and income. Industry classification is based on publicly available information about each company, and is primarily obtained from such company's annual report and Form 10-K. The securities in the universe are selected using a proprietary methodology developed by Morningstar. The Fund generally will invest in all of the stocks comprising the Index in proportion to their weightings in the Index.

***Per the prospectus dated September 30, 2009, the Fund's total annual operating expense ratio, gross of any fee waivers or expense reimbursements, is 7.24%. There is a contractual fee waiver currently in place for this Fund through December 31, 2011 to the extent necessary to keep Fund operating expenses from exceeding 0.40% of average net assets per year. However, some expenses fall outside of this expense cap and therefore net operating expenses were 0.45%. Without this expense cap, actual returns would be lower.**

After tax returns are calculated using the historical highest individual federal marginal income tax rates during the periods shown and do not reflect the impact of state and local taxes. Actual after tax returns depend on an investor's tax situation and may differ from those shown. Since Inception returns assume a purchase of the ETF at the initial share price for share price returns or the initial net asset value (NAV) per share for NAV returns. Returns for periods of less than one year are not annualized. Returns include reinvestment of distributions.

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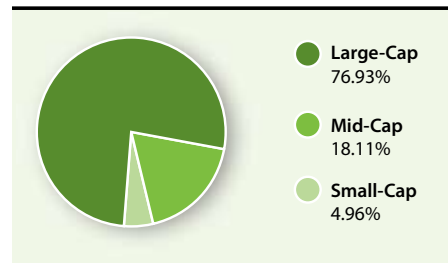

RISK CONSIDERATIONS Investors should consider the following risk factors and special considerations associated with investing in the Fund, which may cause you to lose money, including the entire principal amount that you invest. **Equity Risk:** The value of the securities held by the Funds will fall due to general market and economic conditions, perceptions regarding the industries in which the issuers of securities held by the Funds participate, or factors relating to specific companies in which the Funds invest. **Software/Hardware Sector Risk:** Competitive pressures may have a significant effect on the financial condition of companies in the software and hardware sectors. Also, many of the products and services offered by software and hardware companies are subject to the risks of short product cycles, rapid obsolescence, competition from new market entrants, research and development costs and the availability and price of components. As product cycles shorten and manufacturing capacity increases, these companies could become increasingly subject to aggressive pricing, which hampers profitability. **Media Sector Risk:** Companies engaged in design, production or distribution of goods or services for the media industry (including television or radio broadcasting or manufacturing, publishing, recordings and musical instruments, motion pictures and photography) may become obsolete quickly. Media companies are subject to risks which include cyclicity of revenues and earnings, a decrease in the discretionary income of targeted individuals, changing consumer tastes and interests, fierce competition in the industry and the potential for increased government regulation. Media company revenues are dependent in large part on advertising spending. Additionally, companies engaged in the media industry can be significantly affected by federal deregulation of cable and broadcasting, competitive pressures and government regulation. **Telecommunications Sector Risk:** Subject to extensive government regulation, the costs of complying with governmental regulations, delays or failure to receive required regulatory approvals or the enactment of new adverse regulatory requirements may adversely affect the business of the telecommunications companies. This sector can also be significantly affected by intense competition, including competition with alternative technologies such as wireless communications, product compatibility, consumer preferences, rapid obsolescence and research and development of new products. Other risks include those related to regulatory changes, such as the uncertainties resulting from such companies' diversification into new domestic and international businesses, as well as agreements by any such companies linking future rate increases to inflation or other factors not directly related to the actual operating profits of the enterprise. **Small and Medium-Sized Company Risk:** Investing in securities of these companies involves greater risk as their securities may be more volatile and less liquid than investing in more established companies. These securities may have returns that vary, sometimes significantly, from the overall stock market. **License Agreement Term Risk:** The Investment Adviser's license agreement with the Index Provider to use the Index has a five-year term, and is renewable thereafter on an annual basis. There can be no assurance that the license agreement will be renewed or extended at the end of that term, or that the Investment Adviser will be able to enter into another agreement with the Index Provider to use the Index. If no agreement is entered into at the end of the five-year term, the Investment Adviser may be required to obtain a replacement Index Provider on behalf of the Fund. **Non-Correlation Risk:** The Fund's return may not match the return of the Index for a number of reasons. For example, the Fund incurs a number of operating expenses not applicable to the Index, and incurs costs in buying and selling securities, especially when rebalancing the Fund's securities holdings to reflect changes in the composition of the Index. The Fund may not be fully invested at times, either as a result of cash flows into the Fund or reserves of cash held by the Fund to meet redemptions and expenses. If the Fund utilizes a sampling approach or futures or other derivative positions, its return may not correlate as well with the return on the Index, as would be the case if it purchased all of the securities in the Index with the same weightings as the Index. **Replication Management Risk:** The Fund is not "actively" managed. Therefore, it would not necessarily sell a stock because the stock's issuer was in financial trouble unless that stock is removed from the Index. **Issuer-Specific Changes:** The value of an individual security or particular type of security can be more volatile than the market as a whole and can perform differently from the value of the market as a whole. The value of securities of smaller issuers can be more volatile than that of larger issuers. **Non-Diversified Fund Risk:** The Fund can invest a greater portion of assets in securities of individual issuers than a diversified fund. Changes in the market value of a single investment could cause greater fluctuations in share price than would occur in a diversified fund. **Please read the Fund's prospectus for more detailed information on these risks and considerations.**
