The Claymore/Ocean Tomo Growth Index ETF seeks investment results that correspond generally to the performance, before the Fund's fees and expenses, of an equity index called the Ocean Tomo 300® Patent Growth Index. The Index is comprised of approximately 60 securities selected, based on investment and other criteria, from a universe of U.S. listed companies. The universe of companies includes the 300 companies that comprise the Ocean Tomo 300® Patent Index without limit on market capitalization. The securities are evaluated and selected on the basis of the value of their intellectual property, specifically their patent valuations, using Ocean Tomo's Patent Ratings® software from a universe of U.S. listed stocks using a proprietary, 100% rules-based methodology developed by Ocean Tomo, LLC, the Fund's index provider. The Fund generally will invest in all of the securities comprising the Index in proportion to their weightings in the Index.

***Per the prospectus dated December 31, 2008, the Fund's total annual operating expense ratio, gross of any fee waivers or expense reimbursements, is 5.49%. There is a contractual fee waiver currently in place for this Fund through December 31, 2011 to the extent necessary to keep Fund operating expenses from exceeding 0.60% of average net assets per year. However, some expenses fall outside of this expense cap and therefore net operating expenses were 1.53%. Without this expense cap, actual returns would be lower.**

After tax returns are calculated using the historical highest individual federal marginal income tax rates during the periods shown and do not reflect the impact of state and local taxes. Actual after tax returns depend on an investor's tax situation and may differ from those shown. Since Inception returns assume a purchase of the ETF at the initial share price for share price returns or the initial net asset value (NAV) per share for NAV returns. Returns for periods of less than one year are not annualized. Returns include reinvestment of distributions.

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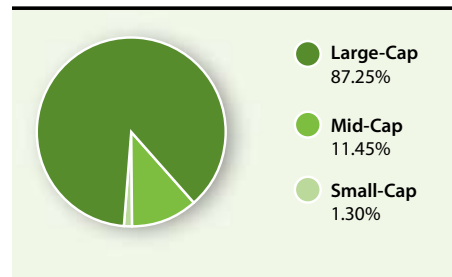

Certain of such companies' industries may be characterized by the existence of a large number of patents and frequent claims and related litigation regarding patent rights. Certain such companies may depend on rapidly identifying and seeking patent protection for their discoveries. The process of obtaining patent protection is expensive and time consuming. Furthermore, there can be no assurance that the steps taken by such companies to protect their proprietary rights will be adequate to prevent misappropriation of their proprietary rights or that competitors will not independently develop products that are substantially equivalent or superior to such companies' products. **Foreign Investment Risk:** Investing in non-U.S. issuers, although limited to ADRs, may involve unique risks such as currency, political, and economic risk, as well as less market liquidity, generally greater market volatility and less complete financial information than for U.S. issuers. **Small and Medium-Sized Company Risk:** Investing in securities of these companies involves greater risk as their securities may be more volatile and less liquid than investing in more established companies. If the Fund utilizes a sampling approach or futures or other derivative positions, its return may not correlate as well with the return on the Index, as would be the case if it purchased all of the securities in the Index with the same weightings as the Index. **Replication Management Risk:** The Fund is not "actively" managed. Therefore, it would not necessarily sell a stock because the stock's issuer was in financial trouble unless that stock is removed from the Index. **Issuer-Specific Changes:** The value of an individual security or particular type of security can be more volatile than the market as a whole and can perform differently from the value of the market as a whole. The value of securities of smaller issuers can be more volatile than that of larger issuers. **Non-Diversified Fund Risk:** The Fund can invest a greater portion of assets in securities of individual issuers than a diversified fund.
